Guest Speaker (5/10) - Ray Anderson, District Governor 2021-2022

Ray has been a member of the Rotary Club of Highlands Ranch since 1997 and was selected to serve as District Governor in 2021-2022. He served as Club President in 2000-2001 and has been on the District Membership Committee, District Visioning, and PETS

Facilitation. He is a Paul Harris Fellow and a member of the Paul Harris Society. Ray was born in Evanston, IL and moved to Coral Gables, FL in 1955. He went



to Florida State University and received a Bachelor Degree in Business in 1972. While there, he met his wife and married in 1974 and subsequently moved to North Dakota, where he began his career as a Landman in the oil and gas industry. This brought him to Colorado and he retired in 2019.

Ray states it's a treat to visit all his clubs in the District with a focus to support the clubs and what they are doing in the community. **Ray** refers to a 1950's movie, "The Day the Earth Stood Still", and the message of patrolling the earth. With the worldwide perspective of Rotary today, Rotary patrols the earth and finds ways to end polio, to find peace and understanding, to fight disease, to provide clean water and sanitation, to protect the environment and to promote economic and community development. **Ray** states our Club is small but he's impressed with our energy and all the projects we are working on, including WooHooManity Challenge, Fruit Sales, Food Bank of the Rockies, to name a few. **Ray** talked about the Colorado bill to create a Colorado rotary license plate which is now on the Governor's desk for approval. He encouraged our club to apply for grants.
