Guest Speaker: Bruce Johnson, Club Member for 37 years. Topic: June 6, 1944 and Beyond.....

Bruce was born on D-Day, June 6, 1944, the day the Allied Forces landed on the five beaches of Normandy to defeat the German forces. He was born to Kenneth and Alice Johnson and raised in rural Hershey, Nebraska. His father farmed and worked for Union

Pacific Railroad. His mother was a housewife and worked at the Hershey School as a cook and server. He began school in a one-room country schoolhouse. His playmates were a horse named "Doc" and a dog named "Shep". He attended Hershey High School from 1957-1962 and played high school football, track and



assistant coach for the basketball team. He went to his first Husker game in 1960 and has been a die-hard fan ever since. He moved to Denver and attended Parks Business School. His first job was with J C Penney as a stock boy and eventually selling shoes. In 1966 he moved to Fort Collins and attended CSU for a brief time. He volunteered for the draft in 1967. During his time in the military, he became an ER Medic and served in Okinawa during the Viet Nam era. He made Spec 5 very quickly and returned home and to CSU in 1969. Bruce and a buddy backpacked across Europe in 1971 and visited 10 countries. He skied Zermatt on July 4, 1971. He then moved to Steamboat and operated heavy equipment on the mountain for several years. Moving back to Denver in 1974 he worked for Keebler Company and Banker Nichols Food Brokerage. His long-term career in commercial real estate began in 1981. He met his wife, **Barbara**, at that time. His son, **Christopher**, was born in 1984. He officially joined Rotary in 1985 and held all offices and worked on RYLA. Barbara and Bruce attended the Rotary International Convention in Thailand in 2012. They own a couple condos in Granby Ranch and enjoy spending time in the mountains. They acquired a blended family in 2016 and enjoy their 4 grandkids. Bruce's hobbies include collecting calendars of all kinds, "good-ole boy" caps, listening to country western music and viewing Facebook.

As an adjunct, **Bruce** played piano for 3 years and did acting in Hershey High School and Steamboat, which he loves to act.
